

European projects

63 years ago, on 25 March 1957, the six founding Member States of the European Union (Belgium, France, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and West Germany) signed the Treaty of Rome, establishing the European Economic Community. Spain joined in 1986.

This forms the legal basis of today's European Union which covers 28 countries in economic and political cooperation through a series of treaties, institutions, the single market, free movement of goods, services, people and money.

Research is considered a **key objective** since the begining, and it is structured through the ERA (European Research Area) and specifically through the different Research Programs and Organizations depending on the **European Commission**





European projects

Funding for our research must come through different channels and European Projects may be one of them. Moreover, participation in European projects is being considered a measure of:

- the research capacity of researchers and groups
- their impact beyond our laboratories and offices
- positioning of our work under international standards


European projects have a lower success rate than other national calls, but they imply a deep reflection on what we are doing, what impact it has on our Society, with whom we can relate to advance our objectives and how we coordinate with them. In short, how we improve and fund our research.



Horizon 2020 (2014-2020)



Funded with 76B€ it was the biggest research program to the date



Spain was the 4th country in terms of funding (~10% of the Budget), and Aragon received around 144M€ (3x funds received in the last research program)



The University of Zaragoza participated in 113 projects with a Budget of 41,5M€ (first institution in Aragon and #23 in Spain)

Interreg funds cover activities focused on European Regional Development. Aragon can participate in three of its European modalities: Sudoe, Poctefa and Mediterranean, normally with regions close to the other side of the Pyrenees, but also with other regions in Italy, France or Portugal.

The European Projects Office

The University of Zaragoza recognises the importance of these projects and the complexity of their formation, application, development and justification by establishing a specific office in 2007: the **European Projects Office** (OPE). The aim of this office is to promote participation in these projects, help with the application, manage their development and maximise the returns to our researchers.

At present, this office has 3 administrative staff, 6 highly specialised promoters/managers and a director.

In addition, some research institutes (INMA, I3A, IA2) have internal promoters who take into account the specific characteristics of these institutes..






Main objective: Facilitate the emergence of a research and innovation agenda in synergy with the UNITA Alliance.
