Participation in Erasmus Projects

Engaged in three Erasmus + Projects from 2012 to 2019. They include:

- 1. Curriculum development for PG programme on contemporary India
- 2. EQUAL (Enhancing Quality, Access and Governance of Undergraduate Education in India), British Council; and
- 3. INNOTAL (Integrating Talent Development into Innovation Ecosystems in Higher Education), Bulgaria
- These three projects focused on pedagogy, capacity building, preparation of teaching/learning materials (both offline and online), innovation and entrepreneurship, and enhancement of collaboration with industry

Curriculum Development for PG programme on contemporary India

- Establishment of Centre for Contemporary India Research and Studies, Poland;
- This Project focused on comparative analysis of Indian and European societies from economic, social and cultural perspectives.
- As a part of this, we have developed a Two-year Masters Programme in Contemporary India Studies
- This programme is being offered by the Centre for Contemporary India Studies and Research, University of Warsaw, Poland
- The uniqueness of this project is that it has brought together many scholars, both from Europe and India, working on contemporary India from different perspectives

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EQUAL

This Project aimed at providing better access with high quality and improved governance to be achieved by using ICT in UG

- Under this Project, the following activities were carried out
 - Development of e-content for eight multidisciplinary MOOCS courses on "Natural Resources Management and Sustainable Development". Eight modules of this course were posted on the SWAYAM Platform of Government of India
 - 2. Produced a Joint report with King's College, London, on "Technology Enabled Learning Policies in India and the UK"
 - 3. Organised a two day International Conference during 17th 18th March, 2016 on "Disciplinary Discourses in use of Technology
 - 4. Conducted Teachers Training Workshops on "Online Education Resources (OERs), Pedagogy and Technology", 18-19 October 2016 and produced a Teacher Training Manual
 - 5. Organised First International Student Conference on 23 24 2 July 2016 completely managed by students

INNOTAL

- This Project dealt with
- Integrating talent development into Teaching and learning,
- 2. Research and capacity building through implementation of ICT,
- Establishment of Talent Co-Creation Lab, which is an online platform for collaboration among faculty, staff, students, industry, NGOs, and Government to promote innovative ideas and develop collaborative projects
- 4. Student Community Service and Volunteering Centre in order to enhance employability and engaging students in social service activities.

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- 5. Conducted surveys and prepared reports on
 - i. Scorecards on graduates' employability promotion and Innovation Capacity
 - ii. "Framework for embedding employability in university operations: possibility for mainstreaming entrepreneurship education and innovation training across disciplines"
 - ii. Proposal for review of internship and placement scheme frameworks existing at UoH
 - iii. Implementation frameworks for Student Community Service and Volunteering Centres
- 6. Conducted three training programmes for students on "INNOTAL Platform", "Entrepreneurship and Innovation, and "Converting Innovative Ideas into Entrepreneurial Products"

- Training students to develop innovation and entrepreneurship skills
- Involving University fraternity (faculty, students and staff) in the online interactive platform for academia, NGOs and industry (Talent Co-Creation Lab)

- Relating project outcomes with national policies (for example NEP 2020)
- Linking project outcomes with University policies (for example, developing online education policy for the University)

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- Engaging industry and voluntary sector in curriculum development and research

- Forging collaborations at both national and international levels
- Enhancing the capacities of faculty in developing and implementing e-content
- Preparing students on converting innovative ideas into products, developing entrepreneurial abilities, etc.
